## **THE KIWANIS YOUTH LEADERSHIP JULY CAMP, A Sponsored Youth Highlight**

### **Report on Leadership Camp, October 13:**

Eight former seventh graders shared their enthusiasm for the Leadership Institute, held in the College of NJ (in Ewing). From past experience, we knew of their excitement, and were eager to share it. We had a good turnout of members, including mayor Nelson Vaughan, NJ District governor-elect Marc Litwack, and Builders Club faculty advisor Stephanie Cooperman. Invited guests included the students, their parents, the vice principal and the guidance counselor of Chatham Middle School and the principal of St. Patrick's School,. Invited Kiwanis officials included past NJ district governor Dean Konner, and the president of the NJ District foundation, Rudy Fernandez

Nancy Holt, who, with Marge Ahrens, co-chairs the youth leadership committee, acknowledged the support of Marge, as well as sponsored youth chair Betty Anne Keat, and new member Melanie Sze. She then introduced the eight *graduates* of the Leadership Camp by saying that they "bring credit to, the schools, their families, and to themselves."

First to speak was Solimar Feliciano, who said, "I was one of the lucky ones...for it was a memorable week. We had a special guest who gave us tips on *job preparation and looking professional*. I hope for future experiences."
